8.1 Superintendent Report – October 2024

Superintendent Monkman presented his October 2024 Report:

- Professional Learning October 20th a Non-instructional day, Professional learning Chairperson, Kimi Hisanaga, organized a day of Nisga'a language learning for district staff.
- Revitalization of band Program the district has engaged Bryce Cotton to teach band classes at Nisga'a Elementary Secondary School. The district has redirected \$10,000 of funding towards the purchase of some additional instruments to augment the program.
- Nisga'a School District Social Media Account This month the district refreshed its FaceBook page as a communication platform for the community, staff and students. The page has been rebranded as "Nisga'a School District No. 92 – Gilmuxw" (to tell news – pass on information).
- USport Basketball Teams University basketball teams that came in the valley visited school sites and engaged with students while learning about this place and Nisga'a language and culture. It was an amazing opportunity for our learning to connect with post-secondary basketball players and the organizers of this event are applauded for bringing them into the valley.
- National Day for Truth and Reconciliation Students and staff around our schools acknowledged September 30th National Day for Truth and Reconciliation with events and activities. NESS along with GES marched to Nisga'a Lisims Government building where powerful speeches by youth and community members were delivered.
- Poles Provided to Nathan Barton Elementary October 3rd, the PRGT (Nisga'a Lisims/Western LNG) company delivered a cedar pole in three sections to NBES. This was received in a traditional ceremony by Chiefs of the community. The sections will be used for a carved pole and other carving projects.

8.2 Nisga'a Learner Enhancement Report

Director of Indigenous Education & Early Learning – Tanya Azak Indigenous Education Family:

- Elder in Residence – provides guidance, mentorship and leadership to all educators within the Nisga'a School District

- Helping Teacher promotes inclusion of Nisga'a language and culture, while fostering inclusive and supportive learning environment for all students.
- Support Teacher focusses on supporting all Nisga'a learners in language and culture.

Indigenous Education Council – In collaboration with senior management, we are learning about and supporting the establishment of an IEC. Letters for nominees have gone out. November 1st will be the appointment of these members. First gathering is scheduled for November 1, 2024. IEC Gathering November 12, 2024. Goals for the month: review the IEC materials in preparation of the 1st IEC gathering.
