Nisga'a School District Board of Education Chairperson, Winnie Morven-Hansen, is pleased to announce the appointment of Robert Clifton to the senior leadership team in the school district. He held positions as an Anti-Racism and Diversity Mentor Teacher, and Indigenous Education Consultant for SD39 and has worked as an Adjunct Professor for UBC.

Commenting on his new role, Mr. Clifton shared, "I am confident that my collaborative leadership style, pedagogical expertise, and commitment to addressing the disparity in achievement for indigenous learners make me an ideal candidate for this role. My proficiency in fostering collaborations, driving transformative change, and upholding values of respect and responsibility equips me to lead the district towards sustainable success for all learners."
