However, the safety of our community is paramount and we will do all we can to carry on with learning during this temporary shift to learning at home.

We need to work together as a community for the benefit of our children's education and the health of everyone. We have a responsibility to ourselves and each other to, consistently and calmly, follow safety guidelines and the advice of the Nisga'a Nation.
